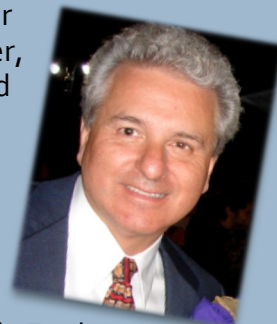
### Nashua Community College

Dr. Fred Bramante is a former middle school science teacher, Gubernatorial Candidate, and lifelong entrepreneur (including being the founder and owner of Daddy's Junky Music stores). He is a past Chairman and longstanding member of the NH State Board of Education. Currently Fred serves as the founder and President of the National Center for Competency Based Learning (NCCBL) a NH based 501(c) (3) not-for-profit charitable organization.
